**The SA Alpaca Movement and Health Vendor Declaration combines animal health, waybill and vendor information for the sale/movement/agistment of all South American Camelids within and into SA. This form is mandatory for the movement of South American Camelids into SA and replaces the Form 1 previously used for interstate certification. This is a statutory document and any false, misleading or unverified statements may result in prosecution. The use of the document for movements of South American Camelids within SA is strongly recommended and if used is a legally binding document.**

**All copies and originals of the forms must be retained for a minimum of 1 year.**

NB. In the event of moving/selling alpaca from the BJD control zone in SA to the BJD protected zone the alpaca must comply with the BJD requirements as outlined in section B3.3 of the explanatory notes.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

#### **PART A Animal Details**

**To be completed by the person who owns or is responsible for the husbandry of the alpacas**

1. Property /place where alpaca/s have been kept

The address and PIC of the property/place where the journey commenced must be recorded regardless of the length of time the alpaca/s have resided on the property/place. If the alpaca/s were walked to the yards on another property exclusively for the purpose of loading at the

commencement of this journey, do not record the PIC of the property on which the alpaca/s were loaded. In such instances record the PIC of the property of last residence.

2. Description of alpaca/s

This section contains both mandatory and non mandatory fields.

Ear tag details should include breed association and management tags.

If there is insufficient space please attach additional sheet in same format and indicate number of attached pages on Declaration.

3. Details of other documents

Other documents relating to this movement eg Health Certificate, Certificate of Pregnancy, Certificate of Castration should be listed and made available to buyer on request.

#### **PART B Movement of Alpaca into SA**

**AN ALPACA MOVEMENT AND HEALTH DECLARATION IS MANDATORY FOR ALL MOVEMENTS INTO SA.**

**The declaration is to be completed by the person who is responsible for the husbandry of the alpaca/s.** Carrier and Expected Date of Entry into SA must be completed for the Declaration to be valid.

##### **B.1 Returning from interstate shows**

Where alpaca/s are returning direct from an interstate show where by Johne's disease restrictions (Ovine and Bovine strains) were in place and the alpacas have not made any other stop overs, the alpacas are **exempt** from the normal interstate movement requirements (as outlined in Part B.3).

##### **B.2 Returning from supervised matings**

Where alpaca/s are returning from interstate where all properties visited conform to the definition of a 'supervised mating' (as outlined in the Australian Johne's Disease Market Assurance Program -JDMAP for Alpaca) and no other stop overs have been made, the alpacas are **exempt** from the normal interstate movement requirements (as outlined in Part B.3). If numerous properties are being visited for matings in the one trip and all do not conform to the definition of a 'supervised mating' normal interstate movement requirements will apply as outlined in part B.3.

##### **B.3 All other introductions of alpaca to SA**

**THE INTRODUCTION OF ALPACA/S INTO SA FROM INFECTED, SUSPECT OR UNDER SURVEILLANCE PROPERTIES FOR JOHNES DISEASE (both Ovine and Bovine) IS PROHIBITED WITHOUT CVO APPROVAL.**

To apply for CVO approval contact your local Animal Health Officer or ring Animal Health head office on 8207 7900.

Complete the following steps to determine the requirements of entry into SA.

1. For the property of origin from which the alpaca/s are being moved, determine the
  - a. OJD score for that property (refer to local DPI office in that state or visit [www.pir.sa.gov.au](http://www.pir.sa.gov.au)) and record in part C.1.2 of the Declaration. If sheep of differing scores have been on the property within the last 5 year record the lowest OJD score present in that time period. If the OJD score is less than 4,

CVO approval is needed for the alpaca to enter SA. If the OJD score is 4 or above the alpaca meet OJD entry requirements.

- b. BJD zone the property is in (refer to the local DPI office in that state).

2. For the property to which the alpaca/s are to be introduced in SA determine the BJD zone the property is in (NB Protected Zone of SA equals north of Pt Augusta, remainder of state is Control Zone- for further detail contact the local PIRSA office or www.pir.sa.gov.au).
3. Refer to the table below to determine the eligibility of the alpacas for movement into SA.

**PART C Animal Health Statement**

**To be completed by the owner or person responsible for the husbandry of the alpaca/s**

**C.1 Johne’s Disease**

NB Properties on Q-Alpaca are deemed to have a equivalent status to MN1 Alpaca MAP properties.

C.1.1. Where multiple alpacas of differing Johne’s Disease status are recorded on the one Declaration fill in the form for the animal with the lowest health status or attach separate sheet indicating each individuals JD status.

C.1.2 If the alpaca/s listed have visited multiple sheep properties record the lowest sheep flock status and OJD score visited.

Movement of alpaca/s from one sheep property to another does not alter that property’s OJD score (i.e. the movement of alpaca does not downgrade the OJD score). However it is recommended that movement of alpacas on sheep properties should be restricted to properties of the same or higher score.

C.1.3 If the alpaca/s listed have visited multiple cattle properties record the lowest cattle herd status and Dairy Herd Score (if applicable).

**C.2 Other**

If insufficient room to record all treatments please attach additional pages and indicate on the front of form the number of attached pages.

**PART D Declaration**

To be completed by the owner or person responsible for the husbandry of the alpaca/s. Signing Part D has legal significance and regulatory authorities may take legal action and purchasers may seek damages if any information in parts A B C is incorrect. Before signing you must be absolutely satisfied you understand all elements of the document and these explanatory notes. If the person signing the document has not been responsible for the husbandry of the animals the words ‘person responsible’ should be struck out.

**DEFINITIONS**

**Alpaca MAP** (Alpaca Market Assurance Program)-A Johne’s Disease quality assurance program based on bio-security and faecal testing.

**Co-grazing-** Refers to a situation where alpaca/s have grazed land that adult cattle (>2yrs) or adult sheep (>12 months) have grazed in the past 12 months.

**CVO-** Chief Veterinary Officer.

**PIC** (Property Identification Code)- A unique number assigned to a parcel of land on which livestock are held. In SA sheep, goats and cattle are required under legislation to be registered to a PIC. Registration of alpaca is strongly recommended in SA.

**Q- Alpaca-** A Johne’s Disease quality assurance program based on bio-security and post-mortem testing.

**South American Camelid-** Any animal in the Family *Camelidae* of Genus *Lama* and *Vicugna* i.e. Llama and Alpaca but not those in the genus *Camelus* i.e. Dromedary and Bactrian Camel.

**Supervised Mating-** See Australian Johne’s Disease Market Assurance Program (JDMAP) for Alpaca Manual.

**WHP** (With Holding Period)- is the minimum period that must elapse between treatment of an animal and slaughter for human consumption in Australia.
